	☐ Matches in a waterproof container or re-sealable bag
	☐ Toothbrush, toothpaste, soap, hand sanitizer
	☐ Cash or travers's checks
	☐ Copies of important family documents in waterproof, portable container
	☐ Family and emergency contact information
	☐ Non-prescription medicines, such as pain relievers, anti-diarrhea medicine, antacids, and laxatives
	Items specific for vehicle emergency:
	☐ Jumper cables
st #2	☐ Flares or reflective triangle
	□ Ice scraper
	□ Blanket
	\square Cat litter or sand for better tire traction if needed
	\square Spare tire, wheel wrench, and jack
	☐ Car charger for cell phone
	☐ Duct tape
	□ Snow shovel
	☐ Fire extinguisher
	☐ Windshield washer fluid

st #3	\square Keep your gas tank full in case of evacuation or power outages. A full tank will also keep the fuel line from
	freezing.
	\square Install good winter tires and make sure they have enough tread.
	☐ Do not drive through flooded areas. Six inches of water can cause a vehicle to lose control or possibly stall. A foot of water will float many cars.
	☐ If a powerline falls on your car, you are at risk of electrical shock. Stay inside until a trained person removes
	the wire.
	\Box If it becomes hard to control the car, pull over, stop the car and set the parking break.
	☐ If the emergency could affect the stability of the roadway avoid overpasses, bridges, power lines, signs, and
	other hazards.
